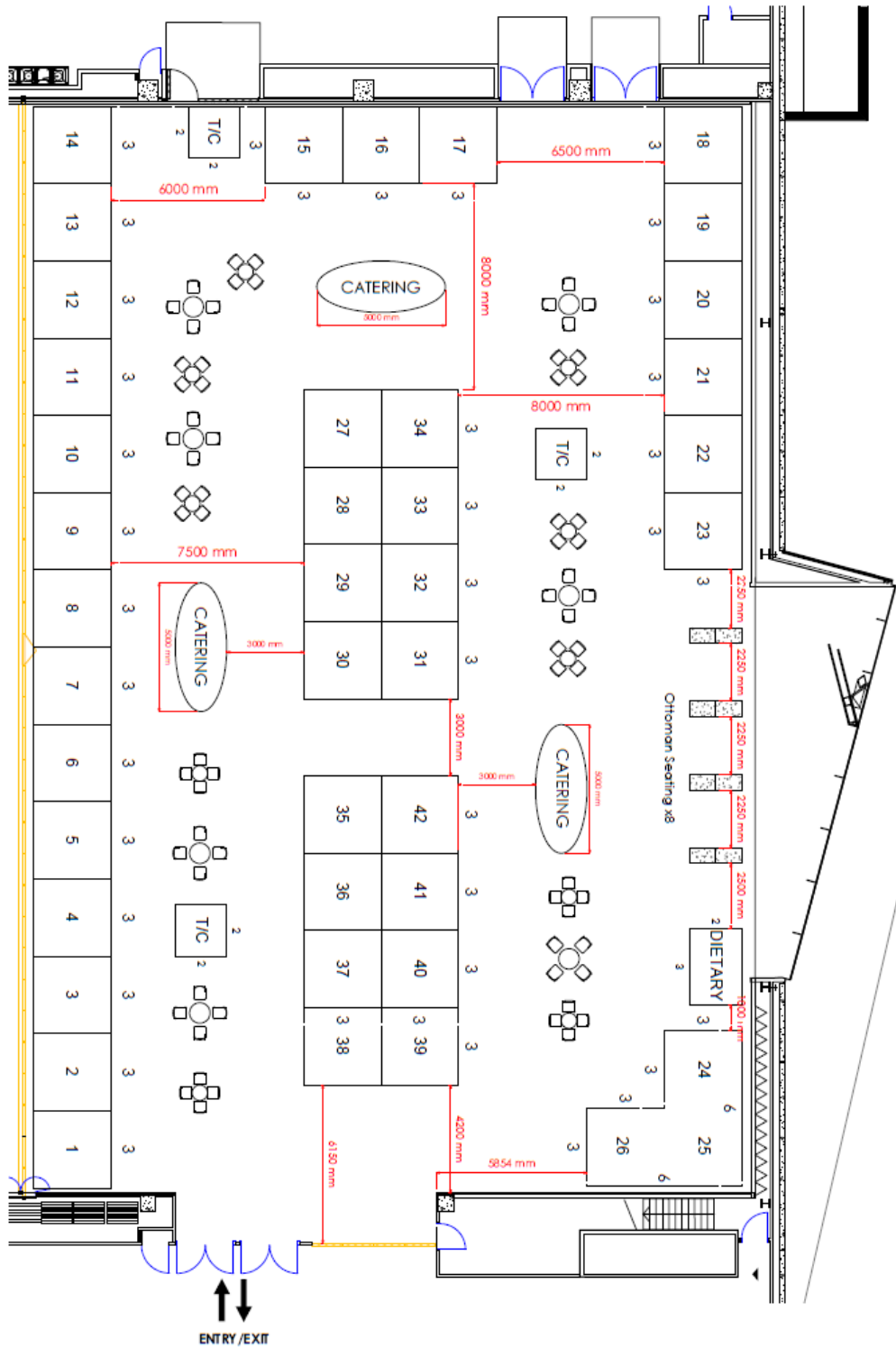

Exhibition Floorplan



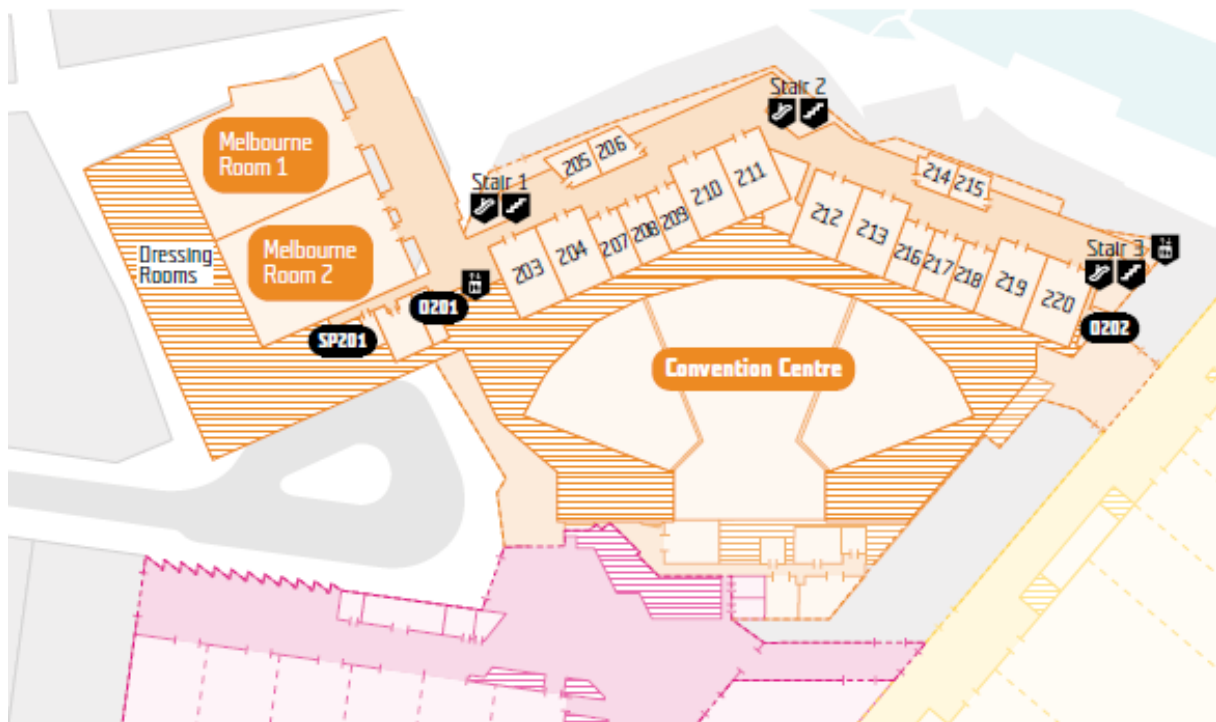
