- Transplantation and PID (TAPID) consultants meeting.


ASCIA Website

- Further expansion of collaborations and advocacy.


SUBMISSIONS AND COMMUNICATION

ASCIA Newsletters


In 2019 ASCIA continued to inform members and community (more 4,000 subscribers) each month about current issues relating to allergy and other immune system disorders.

AIFA Research Program

Since 2015 AIFA has awarded \$250,000 in grants for allergy and immunology research, including \$120,000 in 2019.
